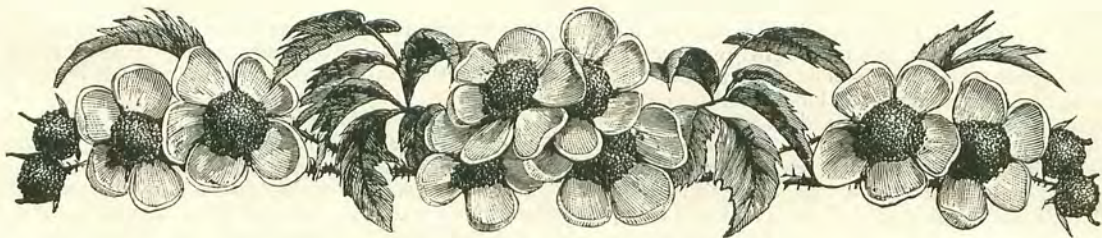




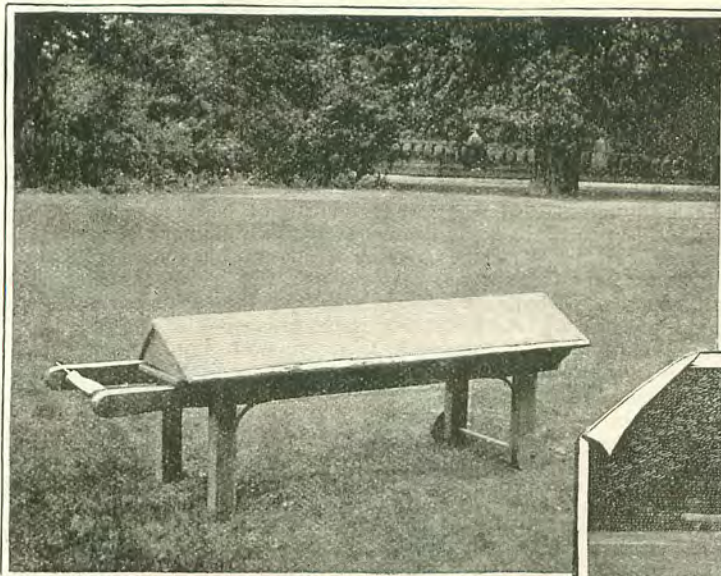

### A CONVENIENT GARDEN SEAT.



Reference to the diagrams will show how easily even a child can wheel the seat along on lawn or footpath. Another advantage is its hinged back, which folds over the seat, and preserves it clean and dry, and ready for use at any time.

This kind of garden-seat may be made of common deal or any durable wood, and when it has had two coats of paint it will last for many years, especially if housed under shelter when not required for use during the winter months.
