Victorian Image Collection: The John Lewis Childs Seed Catalog, 1906

This preview brings you thumbnail images of our complete John Lewis Childs Seed Catalog 1906 clip art package.

Please note that these are thumbnails only and *not* to scale. Thus, you may find a 2-inch image side-by-side with an 8-inch image – and they'll appear exactly the same size. Our purpose is to simply provide an overview of what our package contains.

This collection brings you 336* fully edited images of flowers, fruits and vegetables from the **John Lewis Childs Seed Catalog of 1906**, including two full-color prints.

John Lewis Childs (1856-1921) was a horticultural businessman and politician who founded Floral Park, NY. He is credited as being the founder of the first mail-order seed catalog business in the US. He was also the founder and publisher of the popular *Mayflower* gardening magazine.

Seed catalogs brought the Victorian and Edwardian gardener some of the most stunning floral prints of the era; today, such catalogs are very hard to find, and are considered rare collectors' items. (The Smithsonian has a large online collection of seed catalog images.) In fact, the best source of color seed catalog prints today tends to be Victorian scrap albums, where collectors lovingly saved these wonderful prints.

This particular catalog dates from 1906; however, the majority of the images in the collection actually date from the 1890's, as you'll see from their individual copyright dates. The collection includes 243 floral and plant images, and 93 images of vegetables.

These images are presented at 600 dpi, and, of course, at their full, original size. They are ideal for art projects, scrapbooking, classroom use. Enjoy!
